




Anakaren Perez Nominated by: Anndee Rickey



The 2021 National Championship Softball team brought home the 9th National Softball Championship to Phoenix College with the Commander in Chief, Head Coach Heinz Mueller! Their record speaks for itself, as well as the caliber of their team spirit and teamwork! Here is what great accomplishments they conquered during their winning season! On May 30, 2021, in Oxford Alabama, the Phoenix College Softball Team brought home their 9th National Title under Coach Heinz Mueller, in a 3-2 game against Jones Community College. PC went undefeated with a 5-win, 0-loss record during the national tournament. They ended their season with a 42-game winning streak and a cumulative GPA of 3.25! That's tough to do as student athletes have full schedules all year; practice, conditioning, study hall, travel, and games. This is on top of having a full-time academic schedule. They started the season ranked number one and ended the season ranked number one! In addition to the National Championship, many players received outstanding awards. Five players were recognized as NJCAA All-Americans, seven players were awarded ACCAC All-Conference, All-Region, and three players made All-Tournament MVP of Region 1 Playoffs! Brianna Hardy received the Division II ACCAC Pitcher of the Year Award, NJCAA Division II Pitcher of the Year Award, MVP of the National Tournament award, and the Caroline Chilton Outstanding Hitter of the Tournament Award! She was also recognized with the Female Athlete of the Year Award for the 2020-21 academic year by the NJCAA. The "Betty Grable Female Athlete of the Year" award is especially noteworthy because it is given to the best female athlete in all sports. It is the most highly-regarded award that an individual can receive in college athletics. Ali Ashner was given Division 2 ACCAC Player of the Year and made All-Tournament Team. Coach Mueller also received an award as the "Coach of the Tournament" Award! It's amazing to work and they 'FINISHED IT'! With all the obstacles they could've met through this COVID season, they still managed to meet their goal and bring home a National Championship to PC!
