	Setup Online Student Center: http://my.maricopa.edu/checklist/new-student/set-online-student-center-0
	Visit VA Counselor at the VA Regional Office and obtain VA Form 28-1905 and bring copy to Veteran Services at PC.
	Apply for Arizona In-State Tuition: Any veteran who is honorably discharged on their DD-214 , who has an Arizona driver's license, and who has an Arizona voter's registration card is eligible for in-state tuition.
	Provide a copy of your Certificate of Eligibility to Veterans Services at PC.
_	If you are new to college and taking mathematics, English or reading, OR enrolling as a full time student AND planning to earn an associate's degree or transfer to a four-year institution, you will need to take placement tests to help determine proper course selection. 	Request official transcripts from your branch of services, from your high school, and from all previous schools that you have attended and have them sent to:

_	Sign Up for a Bear Trax Session: Bear Trax is an advising session and orientation for all new to college students who are planning to complete a degree or transfer to a university, and attending either full-time or part-time. After taking the placement test, all new to college students who meet the above criteria will enroll in a Bear Trax session that is most convenient. Your VA Representative can assist your registering in one of the NSO sections.
	Meet With an Academic Advisor: Career Services can help veterans in selecting a career goal to help you use your VA benefits wisely. My program of study will be: VA students can only be certified for classes that apply to their program of study.
<u>-</u>	After enrolling in your classes, see your Certifying Official at Veterans Services at PC. NOTE: Notify your Certifying Official BEFORE making any changes to your class schedule. Any change could affect your VA educational benefits, and you could be held responsible to payback any overpayments that may occur.
	Attend My College Orientation
	Attend all classes and complete all finals. Failure to do so may result in an overpayment that you will be responsible for paying. A failing grade received after attending all classes could avoid an overpayment.
	Priority Registration: Veterans can enroll in classes one week BEFORE the general population.
