

Escena Uno: Re-Comienzos/Scene One: Re-Beginnings

After tragedy strikes the family, they begin to rebuild their lives; and then we meet Eleanor.

Escena/Scene 2: El Bosque y la Decisión/The Woods and the Decision

At a crossroads, each of the sisters takes a different path.

Escena/Scene 3: Beatrix y el Océano/Beatrix and the Ocean

Beatrix conoce a la Mujer del Faro y juntas se embarcan bajo el océano.

Beatrix meets the Lady in the Lighthouse and together they set out under the ocean.

Escena/Scene 4: Albienne y la Guerra/Albienne and the War

THE CAST

By entering this production, our theater department is sharing in the KCACTF goals to recognize, reward, and celebrate the exemplary work produced in college and university theaters across the nation.

Special Dedication Note from our Director:

One of my favorite memories of Rody took place in the Costume Shop behind the John Paul Theatre. We were preparing to EmCee one of the first events in our Centennial celebrations and someone had the idea to have us dress in costumes from the different decades since 1920. The Costume Shop is filled with random items in all different sizes. I laughed as I took out these red velvet bell bottoms from "the sixties." As I handed them to Rody I said, "These probably won't fit, but try them on just for fun!" They fit like a glove. The same thing happened with a pair of black leather pants from "the fifties" (not pictured here). I was amazed! The Miami Vice suit also looked fantastic on Rody, as you can see! The essence of this memory is that Rody FIT at PC!

One of the students in this production, Jakob Salcedo, was a student in Rody's class last summer. One afternoon, after class, Rody came to my office with Jakob and said, this young man is meant to do theatre. And he turned to him and said, "This is Dr. Marín. You need to work with her." We are forever grateful to him.

We dedicate this production to Rody, because he was always a friend to the theatre. We will always reserve a seat for him in the audience and know that he is watching us.
